

James Madison College, Michigan State University seeks candidates for a tenure track position at the Assistant Professor level in Comparative Cultures and Politics (CCP), an interdisciplinary major that draws on social sciences and humanities. Applicants must have substantive expertise in applied international development in India and/or South Asia. We are particularly interested in candidates whose research takes an interdisciplinary approach to issues of poverty, caste, class, religion, gender, and/or community mobilization and speaks to fields such as cultural studies, development studies, gender studies, political economy, and/or sustainability studies.

The successful candidate will teach in the introductory Comparative Cultures and Politics sequence and the upper division curriculum, including an elective course on culture/s, politics and society in South Asia and a senior capstone seminar, and contribute to the College's first year program. Applicants should demonstrate commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching in an interdisciplinary program and to achieving a substantial record of scholarship. The teaching load is 2-3, 2-2. Ph.D. in a related field is required by time of appointment.

Supporting materials should include a vita, transcript, three confidential letters of recommendation that speak to teaching expertise and scholarly promise, evidence of teaching approach and effectiveness, sample syllabi, and a sample of scholarship (e.g., dissertation chapter, article, conference paper).
